


Term four has been an absolute whirlwind of action and fun.

a Storytime incursion shared by Chris from our local



team supported the children in really focusing in on pulling together some of the learning concepts they have developed throughout the year as they explored increasingly complex literacy and numeracy activities.

A popular topic in our classroom related to exploring food and traditional dance from around the world. We had lots of fun having a go at the Haka and Tarantella dances together. Currently the children are enjoying working on Christmas craft, and preparing to wow with their songs at the Christmas concert we will share with our families. We have a Christmas tree in the classroom that the children created with Sue using paint and sparkles. 
We wish you all a Merry Christmas and look forward to another great year together in 2024.


We celebrated road safety week by preparing ourselves to go on a walk to the local cafe - Shane. The children

PLAYDOUGH RECIPE

The children love using playdough and manipulate it to make amazing creations. Many parents have asked for the recipe to make at home.

We have provided a cooked version below which will last for a long time before it dries out.

- 1 cup salt
- 2 cups plain flour
- 4 teaspoons cream of tartar
- 2 tablespoons oil
- 2 cups water

food colouring

Mix all ingredients in a saucepan

Cook on medium heat stirring constantly until
playdough becomes stiff

Take out of pot and knead till smooth

Once cool, store in an airtight container







RECYCLING BATTERIES

Each year, over 300 million household batteries are thrown away with ordinary waste, meaning a staggering 8,000 tonnes of batteries end up in landfill. These batteries then take over 100 years to decompose with the chemicals being toxic to the environment, potentially harming wildlife and affecting surrounding soil and waterways.

By recycling batteries we can help reduce the amount that ends up in landfill each year.

Many supermarkets accept household batteries for recycling (AA, AAA, C, D and 9V batteries). Office works, Bunnings, Aldi, Woolworths are just a few that are local to us. Please try to be kind to our earth and dispose of your batteries thoughtfully.





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
